

Conceptualising Humanising Healthcare

Example – Person-centred care



- healthcare
- Focusing on the care needs of the individual, being respectful and responsive to individual • People rather than patients
- It's not a panacea though
 - Goodley raises questions about who is the person/individual?
 - Individualised ignores structural 0 inequalities
 - Transforms patients into individual "service users", marketised NHS.





What do we do next?

Example 2. Being listened to and feeling heard


- How can post-structuralism help us think about language, connection, and power?




